

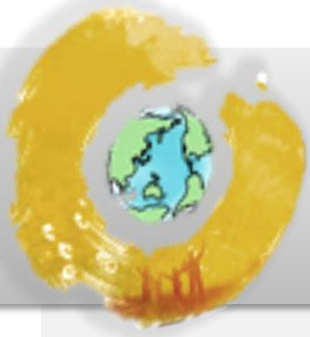

Aims of the Action Package

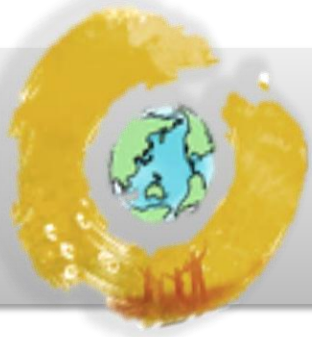
- The Action Package has two primary goals that underpin all our activities:

Leading Countries

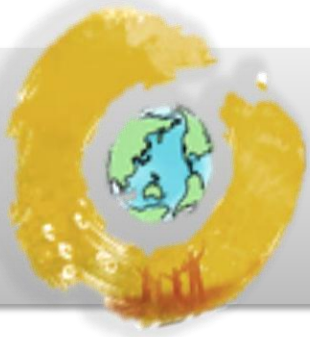

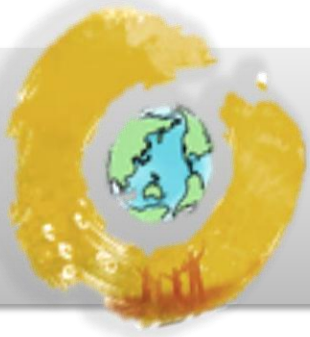
Priorities for 2016

1. **4 action orientated Subgroups** currently:

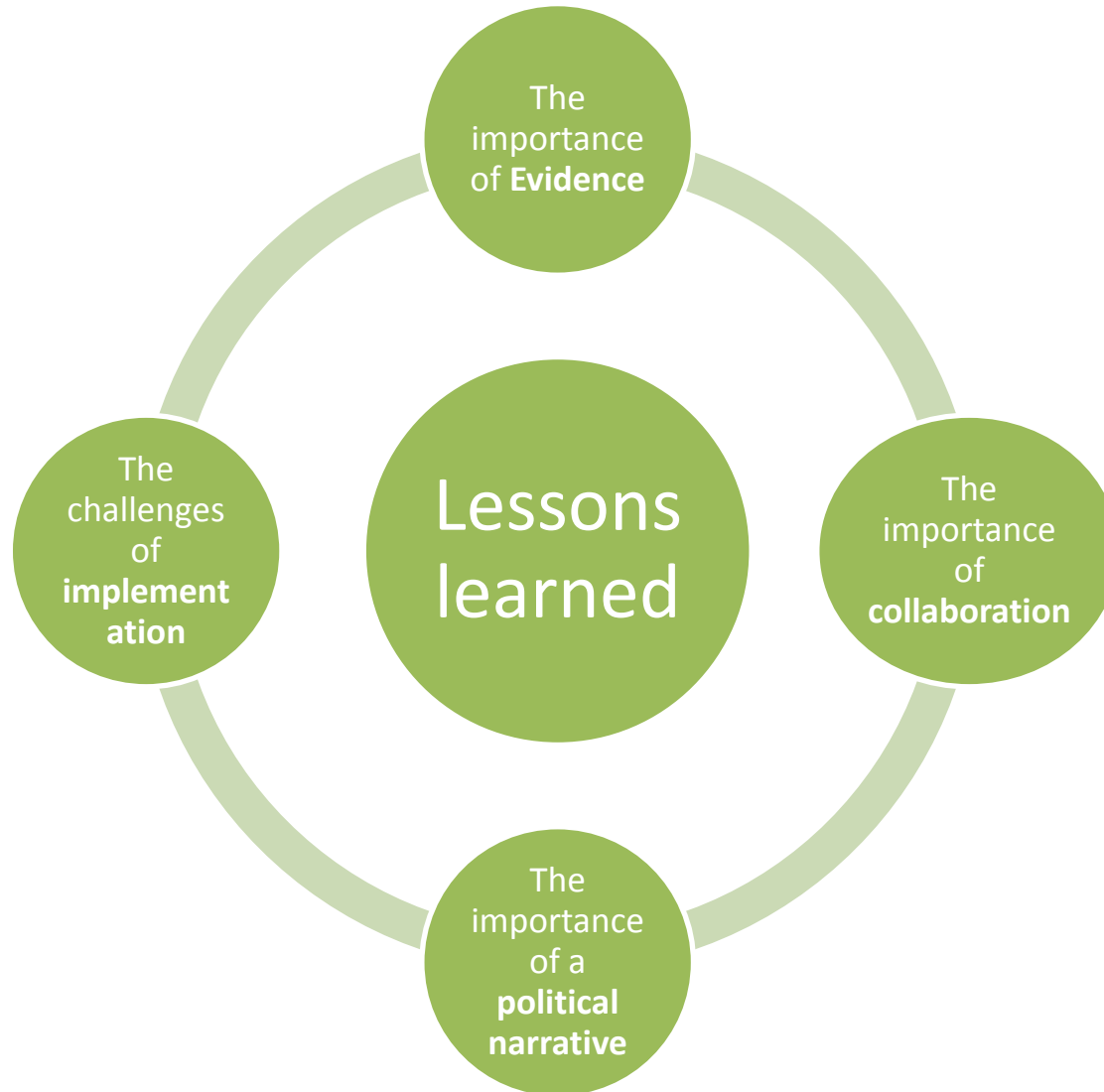
Research and Development .One Health. Surveillance .Stewardship

3. Supporting countries to develop and implement **National Action Plans**



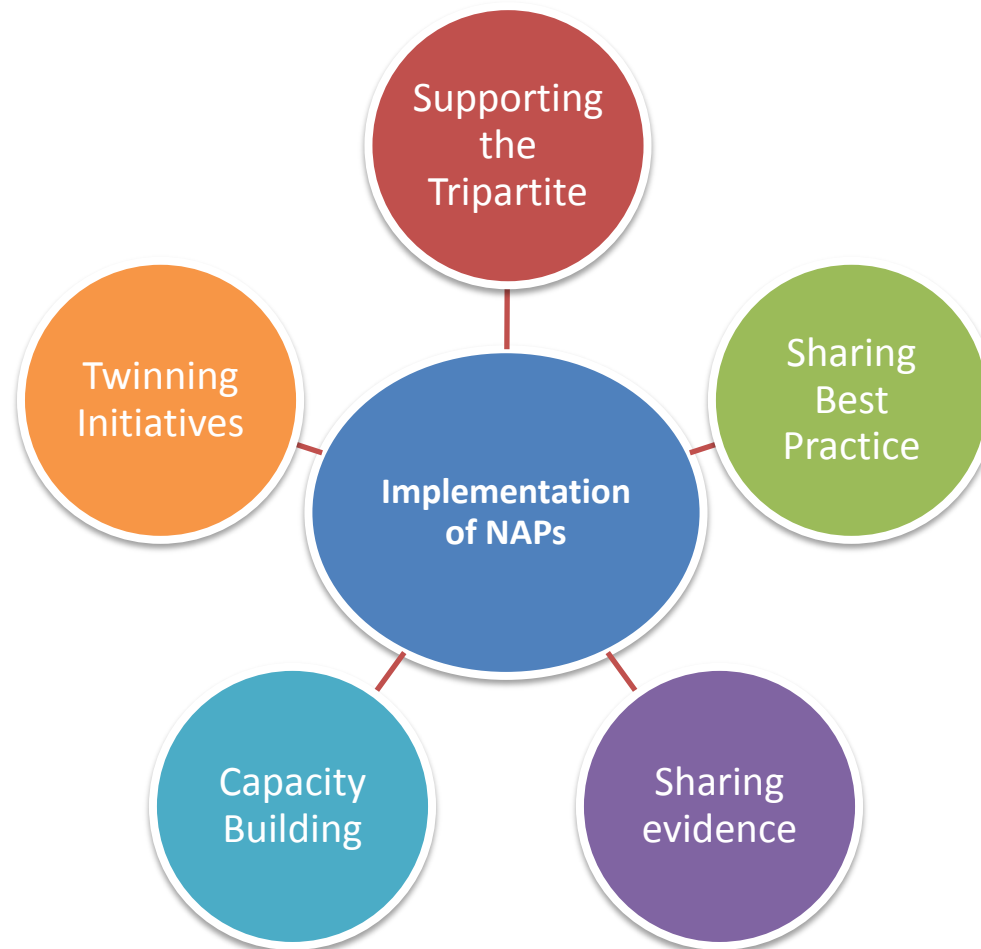

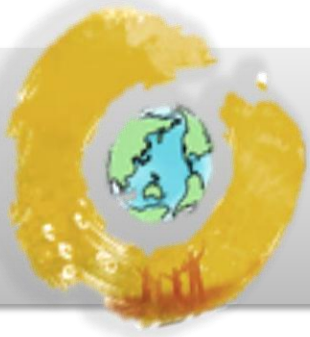




Beyond 2016: From declarations to deeds
