Intent of the Action Packages

- Focus international discussion toward specific, coordinated actions in support of the GHSA
- Highlight measureable approaches countries can adopt to accelerate, monitor and report progress
- Provide a mechanism by which countries can make specific commitments and take leadership roles in GHSA

Commitments

- Lead or contribute to one or more Action Packages
- Work toward achieving the Action Package target(s) on a national, regional, or global basis

How to work

- **Multilateral collaboration**
 - Global collaboration
 - Regional collaboration
- **National implementation**

Successful Approaches

- **Action Package Secretariat**
 - AMR, Biosafety & Biosecurity, Laboratory
- **Regional**
 - Emergency Operations Centers (Malaysia/ASEAN)
 - Laboratory, Workforce Development (Thailand)

Measures of Activity

- **Annual Plan:** Have the members of the Action Package developed a work plan that describes what they hope to accomplish?
- **Communication:** Are the members of the Action Package communicating regularly?
- **Sharing:** Has the Action Package shared tool, procedures, best practices, etc. with others in GHSA?
